This has been an amazing year, watching our residents experience the mighty love of Jesus through their growing relationships with Him! This year, hundreds of hearts have turn toward Him, the hearts of our men, women, and kiddos. When a heart turns toward Him, miracles happen and eternity changes.

Giana was 8 and 10 years old when she came to Metro Hope to spend weekends with her mom, Mikki. Today, she is 17 years old and she courageously shared her story at Metro Hope's Gala in September.









"Both of my parents were addicted to meth and some of my earliest memories where when we were getting pulled over all the time by the police while they searched our car with the drug dogs because of the things that my biological father was doing. When I was 5, that was the first time I remember my dad going to jail. Shortly after that was when my grandma took me out of my mom's care for my own safety. I would cry daily for my mom and all I did was want my mom but I couldn't have her because of her addiction. When I was about 8, my dad was sentenced to 17 years in federal prison. It was one of the hardest things I had to deal with. Around the same time my dad was sentenced to prison, my mom went to Metro Hope with me for the first time. I remember doing fun things like going horseback riding, to the splash pad, the park and church. I also met other kids who had similar experiences as I had. Shortly after my mom graduated Metro Hope, she relapsed, and once again, I was left feeling like she chose drugs over me. This time I didn't know if I would see my mom in 3 days or in a month. My grandparents put me in track, cheerleading and karate just to distract me from everything that was going on in my life. In 2016 my mom and (her boyfriend) Oscar were arrested. The things they were doing were honestly outrageous and crazy and I would have never took them as the type of people to do that, especially when my mom knew I needed her when my dad was in prison. On my 10th birthday, my mom was released from jail and my mom and Oscar went to Metro Hope. I was hurt and mad for a very long time. I remember when my mom got sober in 2016, and I would tell her that I hated her and I never wanted to be with her.

Our life now is a life I never thought that I would be able and willing to have. Not only because I have my mom back in my life, but Metro Hope saved my mom and our family in ways that I couldn't even explain. Faith in God kept our family going and makes our family stronger. I want to thank you grandma who took care of me and raised me like her own. Thank you to my amazing dad, Oscar, who filled a void in my heart and stepped up to be my dad when he didn't have to, to show me the love that I needed. And thank you to Metro Hope for giving me my family back and showing me that people can change. And because of my mom and Osacar's relationship with Jesus, they taught me to have a relationship with Jesus and I now know that I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." Giana is a Senior, accepted into nursing school, and loves Jesus!
