Metro Hope Ministries is a Christ-centered, residential recovery program for mothers with children, women, and men who are struggling with addiction and other behaviors that are destroying their lives. For 95 years Metro Hope has been providing real help and lasting hope by revealing the love of Christ to our residents. Through the resident's growing relationship with Jesus Christ, they receive the blessings of sobriety, restoration and reunification of their families. With a new understanding of their purpose and passions, they can enter the world as productive members of society and a blessing to those around them. There is NO requirement for a resident to be a Christian when entering or graduating our 5-12 month programs, we love everyone where they are at.

2021 Service Statistics

Healing House welcomed 69 women, 40 families and 58 children providing housing, meals, necessities and programming.

Upon entry, 50% of the women escaped domestic violence and 83% were homeless.

The women received 40 hours of Bible based education per week with the mothers receiving 24/7 hours of supervised parenting training with their FULL-TIME children. The children received 34 hours of child care programming per week.

20 mothers, 50% of our families, were reunified with their children.

New Hope Center welcomed 224 men providing housing, meals and necessities, 73 into our guest rooms and 152 into long-term programming, all receiving Bible-based education.

Upon entry, 73% were homeless. 85% of men reported previous treatments averaging 4.9 times, 39 men with 10+ treatments.



2021 was a year of growth at Metro Hope! After the "catastrophic roof failure" in February, the men of New Hope Center experienced the mighty power of God as He provided a new roof, answering their prayers. Along with that blessing came a much needed HVAC system replacement. With the support of a dear friend of Metro Hope, we began building a new software program specifically for tracking the residents of Metro Hope. In September, the U of M Occupational Therapy Department began a program at Healing House, sending 2 students who spent time with our women and children, all day - everyday, for 3 months, teaching them the tools and skills to live life well. The students taught a "Parenting Lab", where they would teach the mothers how to play and connect with their children, and handle behavioral issues, then observe the mothers relating to their children. Mothers were also taught how to recognize the unmet needs behavior in their children and how to respond in a healthy way instead of having a trauma response. The women learned how to better care for themselves, and their children, along with healthy food choices, the importance of structure and building schedules. Metro Hope attended many outreach events, hosted our 1st annual Motorcycle Ride for Recover, held a Gala along with a Christmas concert, and advertised on several radio stations. Metro Hope was discovered by many new people creating growth in our donor family.

In April, 2020, Metro Hope received a Federal Payroll Protection Program loan for \$110,160, forgiven in full in June, 2021, as the entire amount was used to pay for the salaries of our employees. We did not layoff any employees during the Covid crisis. To keep our doors open during Covid, we did incur \$105,000 of debt using our Line of Credit, due to the increased cost of food and essentials, along with the requirements put in place by Hennepin County, including Covid sick pay and on-site schooling for the kiddos. We also added \$120,000 to our Line of Credit in September to pay off the balance due for the roof and HVAC system. I am excited to say that today, due to very generous year end giving and a gift of \$100,000 for the Covid expenses, our DEBT IS ZERO! PRAISE THE LORD! This is all possible because of our amazing donor family, Thank you!

But, the most important thing that happened over 2021 is that God's kingdom grew as men, women, and children accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior! To God be the glory!
